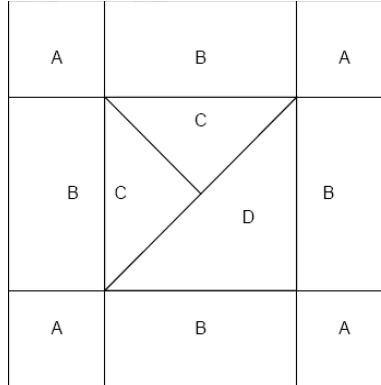


Scrappy Snappy Potholder

Scraps of this 'n that fabric required.

Finished Block Size = 8 1/2"

Unfinished Block Size = 9"

All Seams 1/4"

Potholder is 9" x 9" finished

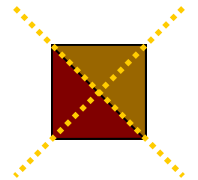
Cutting:

Number	Fabric	Cut
A	Red	Cut FOUR (4) 2 1/2" x squares
B	Brown	Cut FOUR (4) 2 1/2" x 4 3/4" strips
C & D	Red	Cut ONE (1) 5 1/2" square (will use same square for both C & D triangles)
C	Brown	Cut ONE (1) 5 1/2" square

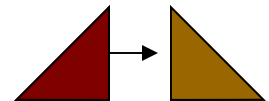
- 1) Cut in a diagonal line, from corner-to-corner, on the back of your Fabric C/D Red Square. Save & set aside the larger piece, that is your Fabric D triangle.



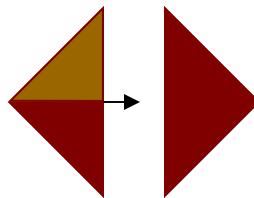
- 2) Lay the other Fabric C Red triangles on top of your fabric C Brown square, matching at one corner. Using your rotary cutter, ruler & mat, cut diagonally, from corner-to-corner TWO times - cutting the Brown into FOUR (4) triangles and cutting the Red into TWO (2) triangles -- you only need ONE (1) of each colored triangle for this block.



- 3) Now, sew ONE (1) of the small Red triangles to ONE (1) of the small Brown triangles, as shown. Press toward the darker fabric:

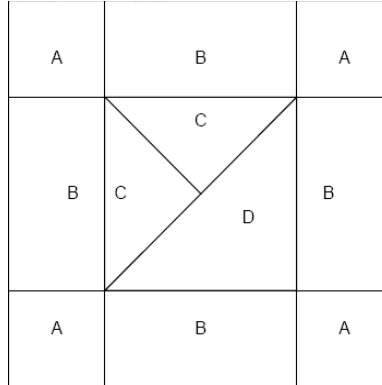
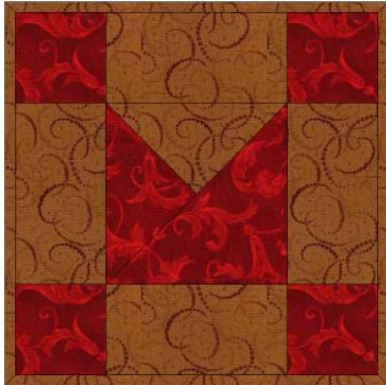


- 4) Now, sew the Fabric C/C triangle to the Fabric D triangle. Press toward fabric D:

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Scraps of this 'n that fabric required.

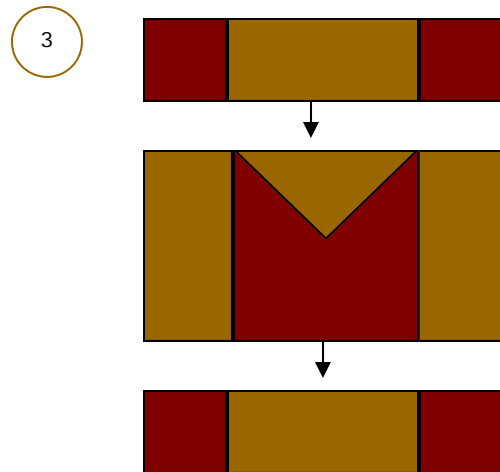
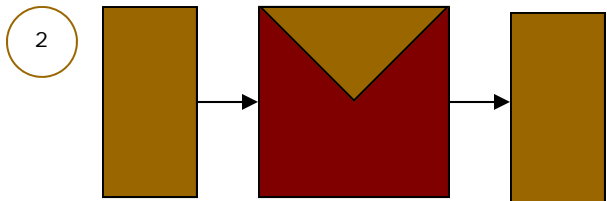
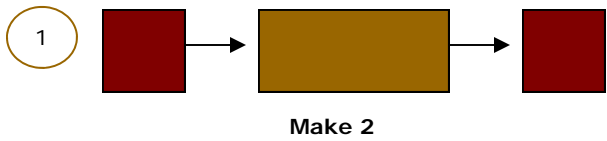
Finished Block Size = 8 1/2"

Unfinished Block Size = 9"

All Seams 1/4"

Potholder is 9" x 9" finished

5) Continue by piecing the rest of your block together! Press toward the Red fabric:



Finish your potholder with a 1 1/2" strip of your fabric of choice for binding.

NOTE: ONLY use 100% cotton batting, nothing else will protect your table from the heat.
