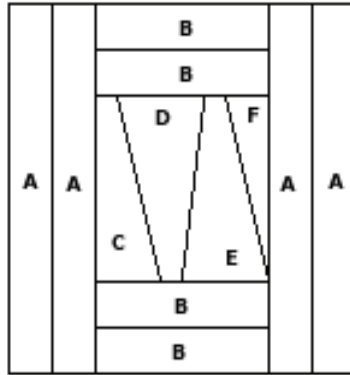
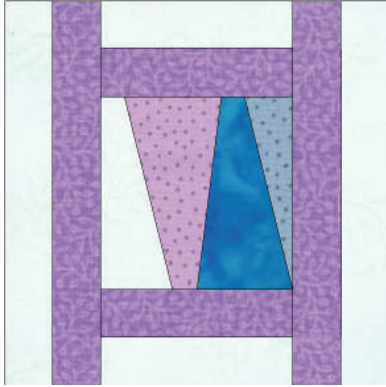


Scrappy Snappy Potholder #5

Scraps of this 'n that fabric required.

Finished Block Size = 8 1/2"

Unfinished Block Size = 9"

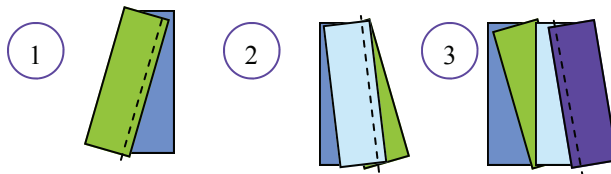
All Seams 1/4"

Potholder is 9" x 9"
Finished with 1/4" binding

Cutting:

Number	Fabric	Cut
A	Light Blue	Cut TWO (2) 1 1/2" x 9" strips
A	Purple	Cut TWO (2) 1 1/2" x 9" strips
B	Light Blue	Cut TWO (2) 1 1/2" x 4 3/4" strips
B	Purple	Cut TWO (2) 1 1/2" x 4 3/4" strips
C, D, E, F	Four complimentary colors	Cut ONE (1) 2 1/2" x 5 1/2" strips

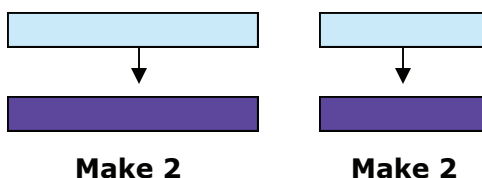
- 1) BOMquilts.com calls the piecing method of this potholder their very own SEW N'SLASH method of quilting. There's no pattern, no rotary cutting requirements and no specific layout for the center of this potholder. Using the C - F fabrics, begin by just sewing them together, with straight seams, from one end of the fabric strips to the other. Trim seams to 1/4" inch. Press toward the darker fabrics.



- 2) Once done, you'll want to make sure your center is pressed well, then square the block up to a 4 3/4" square.

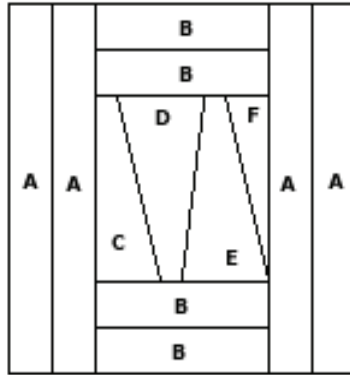
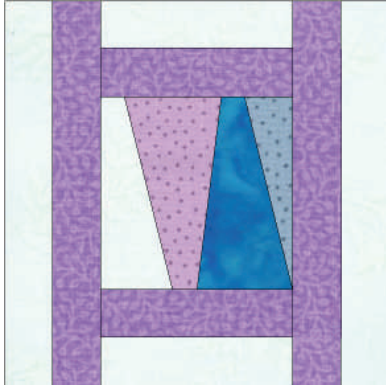


- 3) Sew the A & B strips together, as shown. Press toward the darkest fabric:

Scraps of this 'n that fabric required.

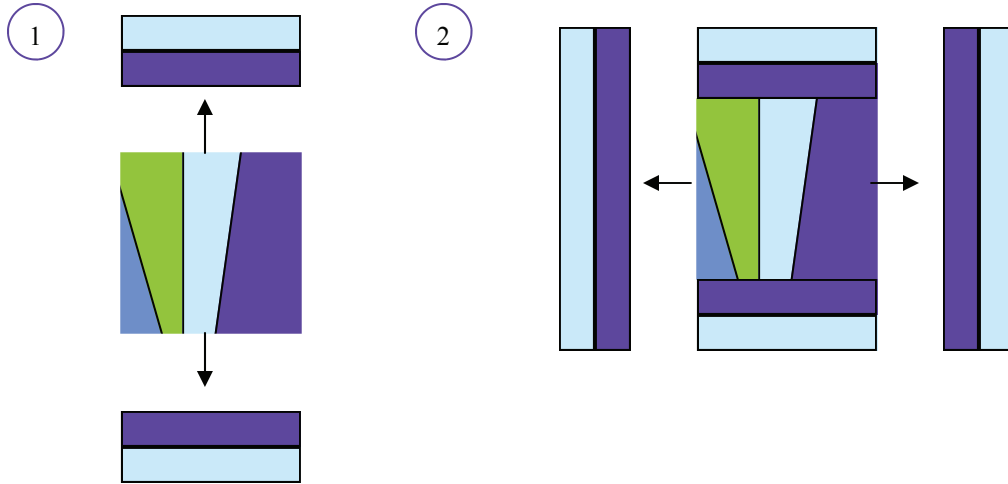
Finished Block Size = 8 1/2"

Unfinished Block Size = 9"

All Seams 1/4"

Potholder is 9" x 9"
Finished with 1/4" binding

4) Begin putting the potholder together, as shown. Press toward the arrows:



Finish your potholder with a 1 1/2" strip of your fabric of choice for binding.

NOTE: ONLY use 100% cotton batting, nothing else will protect your table from the heat.
