All Seams a precise 1/4"

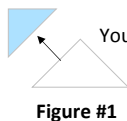
Press in the directions of the arrows.

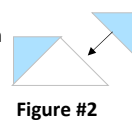
Clue #2

Block #1 - Directions are for ONE (1) quilt Block #1. You'll need **FOUR (4)** of these blocks for this quilt.

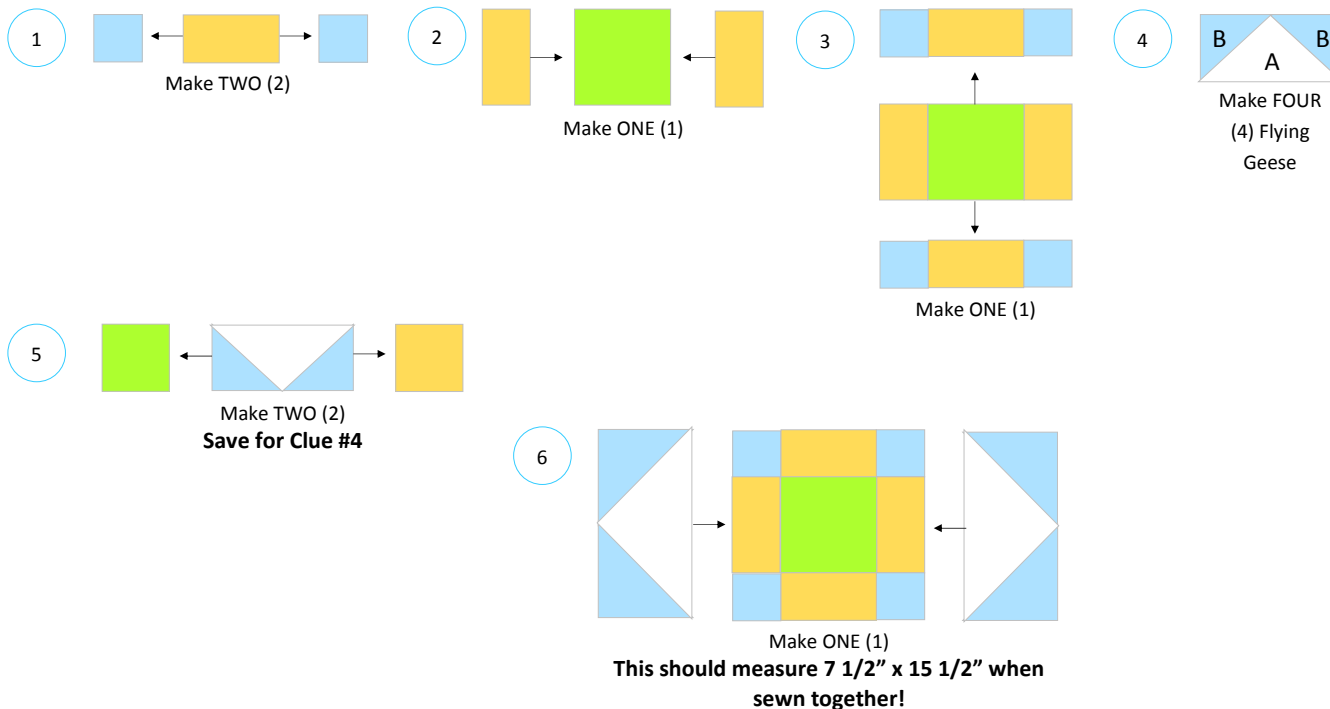
Flying Geese Tutorial



You'll see on my instructions to either cut some squares ONE (1) time or TWO (2) times. Both of them diagonally, corner-to-corner. When piecing a Flying Geese for a quilt block, follow Diagram #1 on the left first (sewing a smaller Blue triangle to the larger White triangle), then follow Diagram #2 on the right (sewing the second smaller Blue triangle to the newly created Blue/White component). This tutorial will complete your Flying Geese! If you're making a quilt block that has a lot of Flying Geese in it, is sometimes best if you press all of your Flying Geese seams open, as it reduces the bulk in your quilt block!



For Block #1 the Flying Geese need to be $3 \frac{3}{4} \times 7 \frac{1}{2}$ " finished & $4 \frac{1}{4} \times 8$ " unfinished

This pattern has been tested, to the best of our ability. If your block does not come out the size shown, please try adjusting your needle position to the appropriate position (left or right) to see if you get the correct block size.
