



"2016 Super Bowl Weekend Mystery Quilt"

An Original Quilt Designed by TK Harrison from BOMquilts.com

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Finished Quilt = 60" square - Finished Block for Quilt = 15"

All Seams a precise 1/4"

Press in the directions of the arrows.

Read ALL Instructions Before Beginning

Clue #3

Block #2 - These directions are for ONE (1) quilt Block #2. You'll need **FIVE (5)** of these blocks for this quilt.

Flying Geese Tutorial

You'll see on my instructions to either cut some squares ONE (1) time or TWO (2) times. Both of them diagonally, corner-to-corner. When piecing a Flying Geese for a quilt block, follow Diagram #1 on the left first (sewing a smaller White triangle to the larger Blue triangle), then follow Diagram #2 on the right (sewing the second smaller White triangle to the newly created White/Blue component). This tutorial will complete your Flying Geese! If you're making a quilt block that has a lot of Flying Geese in it, is sometimes best if you press all of your Flying Geese seams open, as it reduces the bulk in your quilt block!

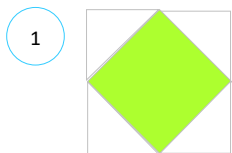
For Block #2 the Flying Geese need to be 3 3/4" x 7 1/2" finished & 4 1/4" x 8" unfinished

Square in a Square Tutorial

You'll see in my instructions to either cut some squares ONE (1) time or TWO (2) times. Both of them diagonally, corner-to-corner. There will also be a larger square associated with it. When piecing a portion of a quilt block that calls for a Square in a Square follow Diagram #1 on the left first, then follow Diagram #2 on the right second.

Press in the direction of the arrows.

For Block #2 the Square in a Square needs to be 7 1/2" finished & 8" unfinished.



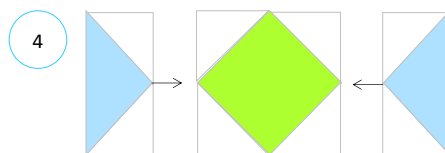
Make ONE (1)
Square in a Square



Make FOUR (4)
Flying Geese



Make TWO (2)
Save for Clue #4



Make ONE (1)

This should measure 7 1/2" x 15 1/2"
when sewn together!

This pattern has been tested, to the best of our ability. If your block does not come out the size shown, please try adjusting your needle position to the appropriate position (left or right) to see if you get the correct block size.

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
