Everything is Coming Up Roses! Twin Star - Block #4

Size: 15" Finished (15-1/2" unfinished)

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Cutting Instructions:

*Fabric:	Size & Shape:	# to Cut:
1 (red)	3-1/2" Square	13
1 (red)	3-7/8" Square	2
1 (red)	4-1/4" Square	1
2 (pink)	3-7/8" Square	2
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3 (green)	4-1/4" Square	1
4 (cream)	3-7/8" Square	2
4 (cream)	3-1/2" x 9-1/2" Rectangle	4


Sewing Instructions:

Step 1: Using a ruler and a pencil, draw a diagonal line on the wrong side of all Fabric 4 (cream) 3-7/8" squares, and eight Fabric 1 (red) 3-1/2" squares.






Step 2: With right sides together, layer a Fabric 4 (cream) 3-7/8" square on a Fabric 1 (red) 3-7/8" square and sew a 1/4" seam on EACH side of the diagonal line that you drew in Step 1. Cut apart on the diagonal lines. Press seams to darker fabric and trim points. Repeat once more for a total of FOUR red/cream Half-Square Triangles.



Step 3: Place a Fabric 1 (red) 3-1/2" square on the right side of a Fabric 4 (cream) 3-1/2" x 9-1/2" rectangle (right sides together) as shown below. Stitch a seam on the diagonal line that you drew Step 1. Trim the fabric above the sewn line to 1/4". Repeat on the left side and press seams toward the red fabric.



Step 4: Using your ruler and rotary cutter, cut the two Fabric 2 (pink) 3-7/8" squares once diagonally, as shown below:



Step 5: Using your ruler and rotary cutter, cut the the Fabric 1 (red) 4-1/4" square and the Fabric 3 (green) 4-1/4" square twice diagonally, as shown below:




Step 6: Sew a Fabric 1 (red) triangle to a Fabric 3 (green) triangle together as shown below. Press seams toward the darker fabric and trim points. Repeat for a total of FOUR (4) Fabric 1/Fabric 3 triangles.



Step 7: Sew a Fabric 2 (pink) triangle to the long side of a Fabric 1/Fabric 3 triangle as shown below. Press seam toward the Fabric 2 triangle. Repeat for a total of FOUR (4) Split Half-Square triangles.



Step 8: Arrange the Fabric 1 3-1/2" squares and the Split Half-Square Triangles (from Step 7) as shown below. Sew into rows and press seams away from the Split Half-Square triangles. Sew the rows together to form the center of the block. Press seams toward the center row.




Step 9: Sew a Fabric 1/Fabric 4 Half-Square Triangle (Step 2) to each side of a Fabric 1/Fabric 4 rectangle, as shown below. Repeat for a total of TWO (2).




Stitch & press (make 2)

Step 10: Sew a Fabric 1/Fabric 4 rectangle to EACH side of the block center and press seams toward the center square.



Stitch & press

Step 11: Sew the rows that you made in Step 9 to the top and bottom to finish the block. Press seams toward the inside of the block.



Stitch & press

The quilt block should measure 15-1/2" at this point. It will measure 15" when it is sewn into the quilt.
