## Everything is Coming Up Roses! Double T - Block #5

Size: 15" Finished (15-1/2" unfinished)

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## **Cutting Instructions:**


*Fabric:	Size & Shape:	# to Cut:
1 (red)	3-1/2" Square	8
1 (red)	3-7/8" Square	4
1 (red)	2" x 3-1/2" Rectangle	8
2 (pink)	3-7/8" Square	2
2 (pink)	2" Square	16
3 (green)	3-1/2" Square	1
4 (cream)	3-7/8" Square	2
4 (cream)	3-1/2" x 9-1/2" Rectangle	4

## **Sewing Instructions:**


**Step 1:** Using a ruler and a pencil, draw a diagonal line on the wrong side of all Fabric 4 (cream) 3-7/8" squares, and eight Fabric 1 (red) 3-1/2" squares.




**Step 2:** With right sides together, layer a Fabric 4 (cream) 3-7/8" square on a Fabric 1 (red) 3-7/8" square and sew a 1/4" seam on EACH side of the diagonal line that you drew in Step 1. Cut apart on the diagonal lines. Press seams to darker fabric and trim points. Repeat once more for a total of FOUR (4) red/cream Half-Square Triangles.




**Step 3:** Place a Fabric 1 (red) 3-1/2" square on the right end of a Fabric 4 (cream) 3-1/2" x 9-1/2" rectangle (right sides together) as shown below. Stitch a seam on the diagonal line that you drew Step 1. Trim the fabric above the sewn line to 1/4". Repeat on the left end and press seams toward the red fabric.



**Step 4:** Using your ruler and pencil, draw a diagonal line on the back of the two Fabric 2 (pink) 3-7/8" squares, as shown below:




**Step 5:** Place a Fabric 2 (pink) 3-7/8" square on a Fabric 1 (red) 3-7/8" square, right sides together. Sew a 1/4" seam on both sides of the diagonal line that you drew in Step 4. Cut apart on the line. Press seams to darker fabric and trim points. Repeat with the second pair of Fabric 2 (pink) and Fabric 1 (red) squares for a total of Four (4) Fabric 2/Fabric 1 Half-Square Triangles.




**Step 6:** Using your ruler and pencil, draw a diagonal line on the back of the all (16) Fabric 2 (pink) 2" squares, as shown below:




**Step 7:** Place a Fabric 2 (pink) 2" square on the right end of a Fabric 1 (red) 2" x 3-1/2" rectangle (right sides together) as shown below. Stitch a seam on the diagonal line that you drew Step 6. Trim the fabric above the sewn line to 1/4" and press the seam toward the pink fabric. Repeat on the left end and press the seam toward the pink fabric. Repeat FIFTEEN (15) more times for a total of 16 Fabric 2/ Fabric 1 Flying Geese units.



**Step 8:** Sew two Flying Geese units from Step 7 together as shown below. Press the seam toward the long edge of the red triangle. Repeat THREE (3) more times for a total of FOUR (4).



**Step 9:** Arrange the Half-Square Triangles, Flying Geese, and the Fabric 3 (green) 3-1/2" square as shown below. Sew into rows and press seams toward the Flying Geese (or press them open). Sew the rows together to form the center of the block. Press seams toward the center row.




**Step 10:** Sew a Fabric 1/Fabric 4 Half-Square Triangle (Step 2) to each side of a Fabric 1/Fabric 4 rectangle, as shown below. Repeat for a total of TWO (2).




Stítch & press (make 2)

**Step 11**: Sew a Fabric 1/Fabric 4 rectangle to each side of the block center and press seams toward the center square.



Stitch & press

**Step 12:** Sew the rows that you made in Step 10 to the top and bottom to finish the block. Press seams toward the inside of the block.



Stitch & press

The quilt block should measure 15-1/2" at this point. It will measure 15" when it is sewn into the quilt.

This pattern has been tested, to the best of our ability. If your block does not come out the size shown, please try adjusting your needle position to the appropriate position (left or right) to see if you get the correct block size.
