
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"Christmas Pine's Table Runner"

Finished Size = 16" x 46"

Block Size = 14" finished & 14 1/2" unfinished

This table runner is more for a confident beginner. I have faith that a beginner can do it! It only employs squares, Half-Square Triangles & a Square in a Square for each block.

So it's not too difficult for anyone who sets their minds to it!


Fabric Requirements for the "Christmas Pine's Table Runner" shown above (including Border & Binding)	
Green	3/4 yard (Includes Sashing & Border)
Dark Green	1/2 yard (Includes Binding)
White	1/2 yard

Cuts Needed for the "Christmas Pine's Quilt Block"		
Color	Cuts	
Green	Cut TWENTY-FOUR (24) 2 7/8" squares. (These are paired with the Dark Green 2 7/8" squares and will create the centers for all THREE (3) of the "Christmas Pine's Quilt Blocks".)	
Green	Cut TWENTY (20) 3 1/8" squares. (These are paired with the White 3 1/8" squares which will create FORTY (40) Half-Square Triangles. You'll need THIRTEEN (13) Half-Square Triangles for each of the "Christmas Pine's Quilt Blocks".)	
Dark Green	Cut THREE (3) 3 3/4" squares. (These are flanked by TWO (2) of a Dark Green 3 1/8" squares and TWO (2) of the White 3 1/8" squares which will create a Square in a Square. This is the "stem of the tree" as needed for all THREE (3) of the "Christmas Pine's Quilt Blocks".)	
Dark Green	Cut TWENTY-ONE (21) 2 7/8" squares. (These are paired with the Green 2 7/8" squares and will create the centers for all THREE (3) of the "Christmas Pine's Quilt Blocks".)	
Dark Green	Cut THREE (3) 3 1/8" squares. Then cut the squares diagonally, corner-to-corner, ONE (1) time. You will end up with TWO (2) triangles per square. (TWO (2) of these will flank each of the Dark Green 3 3/4" squares with TWO (2) of the White 3 1/8" squares to create the Square in a Square. These are the "stems of the tree" as needed for all THREE (3) of the "Christmas Pine's Quilt Blocks".)	
White	Cut TWELVE (12) 2 7/8" squares. (SIX (6) of these are paired with the Green 2 7/8" squares, and SIX (6) of these will be flanked by the results of the Green 3 1/8" squares and the White 3 1/4" squares [which will create TWENTY (20) Half-Square Triangles for these quilt blocks], as needed for all THREE (3) of the "Christmas Pine's Quilt Blocks".)	
White	Cut THREE (3) 3 1/8" squares. Then cut the squares diagonally, corner-to-corner, ONE (1) time. You will end up with TWO (2) triangles per square. (TWO (2) of these will flank the Dark Green 3 3/4" squares, with TWO (2) of the Dark Green 3 1/8" squares to create the Square in a Square. This is the "stem of the tree" as needed for all THREE (3) of the "Christmas Pine's Quilt Blocks".)	
White	Cut TWENTY (20) 3 1/8" squares. On the back side of the square draw a diagonal line, corner-to-corner, ONE (1) time. (These are paired with the White 3 1/8" squares which will create FORTY (40) Half-Square Triangles. You'll need THIRTEEN (13) Half-Square Triangles for each of the "Christmas Pine's Quilt Blocks".)	


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"Christmas Pine's Quilt Block Diagram"

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Tutorial for Half-Square Triangles & Square in a Square

Half-Square Triangles

To make Half-Square Triangles you'll see in my cutting instructions to cut some squares and they'll say, "On the back side of the square draw a diagonal line, corner-to-corner, ONE (1) time." When piecing a portion of a quilt block that calls for Half-Square Triangles, place the square that you **didn't** draw the diagonal line on, on the bottom (wrong side up). Then






place the square that you **did** write the line on, on the top of the square that you **didn't** write the line on. With right sides together, sew 1/4" on EACH SIDE of the line you drew. Then cut the half-square triangles apart **ON** the line you drew (image on the left shows the line you drew in **red** and the TWO (2) lines to sew in **blue**). You will end up with TWO (2) half-square triangles (images on the right). Press toward the darkest fabric and remember to clip your corners (aka dog ears).





BOMquilts.com's Quilt Note



When making Half-Square Triangles, try cutting your fabric squares 1/4" or 1/2" larger than the pattern calls for. Then trim them down to the *exact* size needed for the quilt block.

Square in a Square

To make a Square in a Square you'll see in my cutting instructions to cut some squares and they'll say, "(These will be flanked by the results of" some smaller squares Cut ONE (1) time or possibly TWO (2) times)".

When piecing a portion of a quilt block that calls for a Square in a Square, you'll take larger square and TWO (2) of the smaller triangles, and sew them (right sides together) as shown in the image on the left (pressing in the direction of the arrows). Then repeat the process with the remaining

TWO (2) triangles (image on the right) on the opposite sides of the first triangles.





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Sewing the "Christmas Pine's Quilt Blocks" Together




Steps #1 - #6 employ Half-Square Triangles. While Step #7 is a Square in a Square. Please refer to "Page 3" of this pattern so that you know how to sew both of these together.

All Seams a Scant 1/4" - Press in the direction of the arrows.


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Cutting Requirements for Finishing the "Christmas Pine's Table Runner"		
Green	Cut TWO (2) 1 1/2" x 14 1/2" strips. (Sashing)	
Green	Cut & Piece TWO (2) 1 1/2" x 44 1/2" strips (Top & Bottom Borders)	
Green	Cut TWO (2) 1 1/2" x 16 1/2" strips (Left & Right Borders)	
Dark Green	Cut & piece THREE (3) 1/2" x WOF strips (Binding)	

Sewing the "Christmas Pine's Table Runner" Together



This gorgeous table runner is much easier to sew together than it was to sew each individual block together!

Follow the numbers so you know how to sew the "Christmas Pine's Table Runner" together.

Be sure to press in the direction of the arrows.

Finished Size = 16" x 46"

Once you've sewn the "Christmas Pine's Table Runner" together, then quilt as desired & sew on your binding!
