# "Poinsettia Table Runner"

Finished Size = 15" x 41"

Block Size = 13" finished & 13 1/2" unfinished

This table runner is more for a confident beginner or even an advanced quilter. It employs Half-Square Triangles, Flying Geese & a Square in a Square for each quilt block.

Fabric Requirements for the "Poinsettia Table Runner" shown above (including Border & Binding)	
Green	1/2 yard (Includes Binding)
Red	1/2 yard (Includes Border)
White	1/2 yard



### "Poinsettia Quilt Block"

Make THREE (3)

Finished Size = 13" Unfinished Size = 13 1/2"

Cuts Needed for the "Poinsettia Quilt Block"		
Color	Cuts	
Green	Cut TWELVE (12) 3" squares. On the back side of the squares draw a diagonal line, corner-to-corner, ONE (1) time. (These will be paired with the White 3" squares and will create TWELVE (12) Half-Square Triangles for all THREE (3) of the "Poinsettia Quilt Blocks".)	
Green	Cut TWELVE (12) 3" squares. Then cut the squares diagonally, corner-to-corner, ONE (1) time. You will end up with TWO (2) triangles per square. (These will flank TWO (2) sides of the White 2" squares as needed all THREE (3) of the "Poinsettia Quilt Blocks".)	
Red	Cut TWELVE (12) 2" squares. (These will be flanked by the results of the White 3 1/2" squares as needed all THREE (3) of the "Poinsettia Quilt Blocks".)	
Red	Cut THREE (3) 3 3/4" squares. (These will be flanked by the results of the White 3" squares, which will create a Square in a Square, which will also be the centers for all THREE (3) of the "Poinsettia Quilt Blocks".)	
Red	Cut THREE (3) 5 1/2" squares. Then cut the squares diagonally, corner-to-corner, TWO (2) times. You will end up with FOUR (4) triangles per square. (These will be flanked by the results of the White 3" squares to create TWELVE (12) Flying Geese for all THREE (3) of the "Poinsettia Quilt Blocks".)	
White	Cut TWENTY-FOUR (24) 2" squares. (These will be paired with the results of the Green 3" squares, and with the results of the White 3" squares, which will create TWELVE (12) Half-Square Triangles. These will also be used to create the FOUR (4) corners for all THREE (3) of the "Poinsettia Quilt Blocks".)	
White	Cut TWELVE (12) 3" squares. Then cut the squares diagonally, corner-to-corner, ONE (1) time. You will end up with TWO (2) triangles per square. (These will be paired with the Green 3" squares and will create TWELVE (12) Half-Square Triangles for all THREE (3) of the "Poinsettia Quilt Blocks".)	
White	Cut TWELVE (12) 3" squares. (These will flank the results of the Red 5 1/2" square to create TWELVE (12) Flying Geese for all THREE (3) of the "Poinsettia Quilt Blocks".)	
White	Cut SIX (6) 3" squares. Then cut the squares diagonally, corner-to-corner, ONE (1) time. You will end up with TWO (2) triangles per square. (These will flank the Red 3 3/4" squares, which will create a Square in a Square, which will also be the center for all THREE (3) of the "Poinsettia Quilt Blocks".)	
White	Cut SIX (6) 3 1/2" squares. Then cut the square diagonally, corner-to-corner, TWO (2) times. You will end up with FOUR (4) triangles. (These will flank the Red 2" squares as needed all THREE (3) of the "Poinsettia Quilt Blocks".)

# **Tutorials for Half-Square Triangles, Flying Geese & Snowball Corners**

### **Half-Square Triangles**

To make Half-Square Triangles you'll see in my cutting instructions to cut some squares and they'll say, "On the back side of the square draw a diagonal line, corner-to-corner, ONE (1) time." When piecing a portion of a quilt block that calls for Half-Square Triangles, place the square that you **didn't** draw the diagonal line on, on the bottom (wrong side up). Then





place the square that you **did** write the line on, on the top of the square that you **didn't** write the line on. With right sides together sew 1/4" on EACH SIDE of the line you drew. Then cut the half-square triangles apart <u>ON</u> the line you drew (image on the left shows the line you drew in <u>red</u> and the TWO (2) lines to sew in <u>blue</u>). You will end up with TWO (2) half-square triangles (images on the right). Press toward the darkest fabric and remember to clip your corners (aka dog ears).





# BOMquilts.com's Quilt Note



When making Half-Square Triangles (HST), try cutting your fabric squares 1/4" or 1/2" larger than the pattern calls for. Then trim them down to the \*exact\* size needed for the quilt block.

### **Flying Geese**

To make Flying Geese you'll see in my cutting instructions to cut some squares and they'll say, "Then cut the square diagonally, corner-to-corner, TWO (2) times. You will end up with FOUR (4) triangles." You'll also see to cut some smaller squares they'll say, "Then cut the squares diagonally, corner-to-corner, ONE (1) time. You will end up with TWO (2) triangles per square." In addition, the smaller squares will also say that they, "flank the results of the larger squares". When piecing a portion of a quilt block that calls for Flying Geese, you'll take larger triangle and ONE (1) of the smaller triangles, and sew them (right sides together) as shown in the image on the left (pressing in the direction of the arrow). Then repeat the process

with the remaining triangle (image on the right) on the opposite side of the first triangle.

# Square in a Square

To make a Square in a Square you'll see in my cutting instructions to cut some squares and they'll say, "(These will be flanked by the results of" some smaller squares Cut ONE (1) time or possibly TWO (2) times)".

When piecing a portion of a quilt block that calls for a Square in a Square, you'll take larger square and TWO (2) of the smaller triangles, and saw them (right sides together) as shown in the image on

and TWO (2) of the smaller triangles, and sew them (right sides together) as shown in the image on the left (pressing in the direction of the arrows). Then repeat the process with the remaining TWO (2) triangles (image on the right) on the opposite sides of the first triangles.




# Sewing the "Poinsettia Quilt Blocks" Together

Finished Size = 13" Unfinished Size = 13 1/2" Here's a Diagram of the "Poinsettia Quilt Block". It should help you sew the block together!












Cutting Requirements for Finishing "Poinsettia Table Runner"	
Red	Cut TWO (2) 1 1/2" x 13 1/2" strips (Left & Right Borders)
Red	Cut & Piece TWO (2) 1 1/2" x 41 1/2" strips (Top & Bottom Borders)
Green	Cut & piece THREE (3) 1/2" x WOF strips (Binding)

# Sewing the "Poinsettia Table Runner" Together



These three "Poinsettia Quilt Blocks" are some serious eye-candy for your table! It may be that you want to use it as a wall hanging instead of a table runner!

Sew the "Poinsettia Quilt Blocks" together as shown above and be sure to press in the direction of the arrows.

Finished Size = 15" x 41"

Once you've sewn the "Poinsettia Table Runner" together, then quilt as desired & sew on your binding!
