## **Fabric Requirements**



Fabric A Cowboys on Blue 5/8 yard



Fabric B Horseshoes on Blue 3/8 yard



Fabric C Cacti Blooms on Blue 1/4 yard



Fabric D Colorwash 706 1/2 yard



Fabric E Colorwash 702 3/8 yard



Fabric F Colorwash 208 1/2 yard



Fabric G Moda Marbles 1 yard

You will also need about a 1/2 yard of fusible web, such as Wonder Under.

This pattern has been tested, to the best of our ability. If your block does not come out the size shown, please try adjusting your needle position to the appropriate position (left or right) and see if you get the correct block size.

### **Cutting Requirements**

These cutting instructions are for ONE (1) block. You need to make FOUR (4) blocks for this quilt.

Fabric	Cut	Special Instructions
Fabric B	Cut EIGHT (8) 2 3/4" squares	n/a
Fabric B	Cut FOUR (4) 3 1/8" square	Draw a diagonal line, corner-to- corner, on the back of each of these squares
Fabric C	Using the attached boot template, cut ONE (1) boot from this fabric	BEFORE cutting out the boot, press your fusible web to the back of this fabric
Fabric D	Cut EIGHT (8) 3 1/8" squares	n/a
Fabric E	Cut ONE (1) 9 5/8" square	n/a
Fabric F	Using the attached design template, but ONE (1) design from this fabric	BEFORE cutting out the boot, press your fusible web to the back of this fabric
Fabric G	Cut SIXTEEN (16) 2 3/4" squares	n/a
Fabric G	Cut TWELVE (12) 3 1/8" squares	Draw a diagonal line, corner-to- corner, on the back of each of these squares



### **Piecing Instructions**

These cutting instructions are for ONE (1) block. You need to make FOUR (4) blocks for this quilt.

#### Press in the direction of the arrows.











Sew Fabric D & Fabric G, right sides together, 1/4" on EACH SIDE of the line you drew. Once done, cut the half-square triangles apart ON the line you drew and press towards Fabric G. Make EIGHT (8).








Sew Fabric B & Fabric G, right sides together, 1/4"

on EACH SIDE of the line you drew. Once done, cut

the half-square triangles apart ON the line you drew and press towards Fabric G. Make FOUR (4).














Once you have finished piecing your block, then you need to press the Fabric F design to the Fabric C boot, and then press the boot to the center of the block. Next, appliqué around the design and boot, using a blanket stitch or zig-zag stitch.

Don't forget - make FOUR (4) of these blocks for the "Cowboy Boot Scoot" quit top.


## **Finishing Instructions**

Fabric	Cut
Fabric D	Cut FOUR (4) 5 1/2" squares
Fabric A (border)	Cut FOUR (4) 5 1/2" x 43" strips (you may want to fussy cut these strips)
Fabric F (block sashing)	Cut TWO (2) 2 1/2" x 18 1/2" strips
Fabric F (block sashing)	Cut THREE (3) 2 1/2" x 39" strips
Fabric F (bock sashing)	Cut TWO (2) 2 1/2" x 43" strips
Fabric G (binding)	Cut enough 2" x width of fabric strips to bind your quilt



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

## **Binding Your Quilt**

1) Sew enough 2" x width of binding fabric strips together as shown, to go around your quilt:





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2) With wrong sides together, fold binding in half lengthwise and press. Pin binding to the front edge of the quilt and sew in place using a 1/4" seam (see 1 below). When you reach a corner, stop stitching 1/4" from the edge and fold the binding up and away from the quilt (2). Fold the binding back down and begin stitching again, 1/4" from the folded edge (3).









3) Continue stitching the binding to the quilt until you reach the starting point. Overlap the starting edge of the binding by approximately 1" and cut away the excess binding strip. Tuck the end into the fold and finish sewing the binding in place.



4) Sandwich your quilt front, batting and backing together, right sides of fabric facing out. Fold the binding over the raw edges of the quilt so that the folded edge covers the row of stitching on the back. Using a needle and thread, whipstitch the binding in place.
