Finished quilt = 53" square
Finished Blocks for Quilt = 14 1/2"
Unfinished Blocks for Quilt = 15"

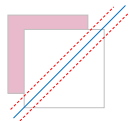
All seams a scant 1/4".
Press in the direction of the arrows.

Read ALL Instructions Before Beginning

There are NINE (9) Different Quilt Blocks that make up the “Mistletoe in the Corner” BOM Quilt. Each one has a different quilting element to it. Such as a: Half-Square Triangle, Quarter-Square Triangle, Square in a Square, etc. Some of the elements are part of the individual block designs.

This tutorial should cover the more difficult elements to sew together.

Half-Square Triangle (HST) Tutorial




HST - Figure #1



HST Figure #2

Place the lighter fabric square on the darker square (right sides together) and sew 1/4" on EACH SIDE of the line (Figure #1). Then cut the Half-Square Triangles (HST's) apart ON the drawn line. Will end up with TWO (2) Half-Square Triangles (Figure #2). Press toward the darkest fabric. Clip the corners (aka dog ears).

 **Quilt Note:** When making Half Square Triangles, try cutting the squares 1/4" or 1/2" larger than the pattern calls for, then trim them down to the exact size needed for your quilt block.



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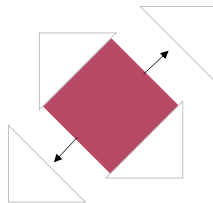
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All seams a scant 1/4".
Press in the direction of the arrows.

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Square in a Square Tutorial

In my "Cutting Instructions" there are directions to cut some squares ONE (1) time diagonally, corner-to-corner. There will also be a larger square associated with it. When piecing a portion of a quilt block that calls for a Square in a Square follow the diagram on the right (Figure #1) first.



Then follow the next diagram (Figure #2) second.

Figure #2

Press in the direction of the arrows & clip the corners (aka dog ears).

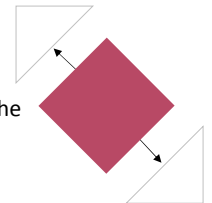

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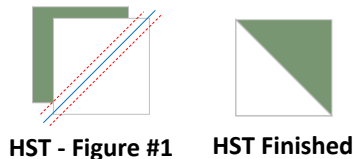
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Press in the direction of the arrows.

Read ALL Instructions Before Beginning

Quarter-Square Triangle (QST) Tutorial

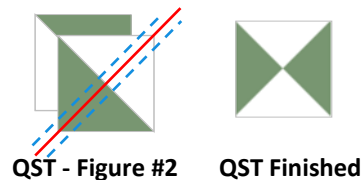
First make a Half-Square Triangle (HST). Place the lighter square on the darker square (right sides together) & sew 1/4" on EACH SIDE of the drawn line (shown in blue in Figure #1 below). Then cut the Half-Square Triangles apart ON the drawn line (shown in red in Figure #1 below). Will end up with TWO (2) Half-Square Triangles. Press toward the darkest fabric. Clip the corners (aka dog ears).

HST Finished

On the back side of one of the HST's, draw a diagonal line, corner-to-corner ONE (1) time (shown in red in Figure #2 below). Nestle the TWO (2) HST squares together (opposite colors nestled against opposite colors) & sew 1/4" on EACH SIDE of the drawn line (shown in blue in Figure #2 below). Cut them apart ON the drawn line (shown in red in Figure #2 below).

QST Finished

Once they've been cut them apart, then on the back side, it's time to swirl the center seam. Do this by popping open the first couple of stitches. This allows them to open it & get the square to lay very flat (read: the seams will lay down better).
